SEMESTER-1

No.of Subject	Title of the Paper	Course Outcome
1	CONSTITUTIONAL LAW-I	The purpose of the course is to acquaint the students with the idea that the Indian Constitution is a normative Constitution with value aspirations.
2	CONTRACT - I	To introduce the students to the basic principles governing contracts and lay a powerful foundation for their study of other transactional and related laws in subsequent semesters.
3	LAW OF TORTS	This course is designed to study the principles of Tortious liability, the defenses available in an action for torts, the capacity of parties to sue and to be sued and matters connected there with.
4	FAMILY LAW –I HINDU LAW	This course is designed to endow the students with knowledge of both codified and uncodified portions of Hindu law.
5	CRIMINAL LAW-I : INDIA PENAL CODE	This course is designed to understand the meaning of crime , methods of controlling them and the essential principles of criminal liability by a study of a range of offences under the Indian Code.
6	ENGLISH	A budding lawyer with a good command over the regional as well as English language can become a competent judicial officer as well as a successful lawyer. So, the need of the hour is to perform well in the field of Law.



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SEMESTER-2

No.of Subject	Title of the Paper	Course Outcome
1	COSTITUTIONAL LAW – II	This course gives the students a picture of Constitutional Parameters regarding the organization, powers and functions of the various organs of the Government. The emphasis is also on the study of the nature of federal structure and its functioning.
2	CONTRACT –II	This course enables the students to better appreciate the law governing special contracts like indemnity, guarantee, agency etc, which are more relevant in the contemporary society.
3	LABOUR LAW – I	In this course, the students are to be acquainted with the Industrial relations framework. Further , the importance of the maintenance of Industrial peace and efforts to reduce the incidence of strikes and lockouts are emphasised.
4	PROPERTY LAW	The focus of this course in on the study of concept of ‘Property’ the ‘nature of property rights’ and the general principles governing the transfer of property.
5	FAMILY LAW -II : MOHAMMEDAN LAW AND INDIAN SUCCESSION ACT	The knowledge of family law is important for lawyers. This course is designed to endow the students with knowledge of boh codified and uncodified portions of Mohammedan Law.
6	Kanoonu Kannada / Kannada Kali	This subject highlights about regional language.



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SEMESTER-3

No.of Subject	Title of the Paper	Course Outcome
1	JURISPRUDENCE	The course in Jurisprudence is designed , primarily, to induct students into a realm of questions concerning nature of law.
2	LABOUR LAW – II	In this course, students are to be acquainted with legal frame work relating to social security and welfare. It is necessary to know the concept of legal social security, its importance and also constitutional basis for the same.
3	LAW OF TAXATION	The object here is imparting conceptual understanding to the students of the provisions of both direct and indirect tax laws.
4	CRIMINAL PROCEDURE CODE, 1973 JUVENILE JUSTICE (CARE AND PROTECTION OF CHILDREN) ACT , 2000 AND PROHIBITION OF OFFENDERS ACT, 1958.	The course is aimed at driving home the students how to pre- trial and the subsequent process are geared up to make the administration of criminal justice effective.
5	ADMINISTRATIVE LAW	Constitutional or otherwise in case of administrative arrogance and consequent abuse of power.



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SEMESTER-4

No.of Subject	Title of the Paper	Course Outcome
1	PUBLIC INTERNATIONAL LAW	The course includes the study of general principles of international law including law of peace.
2	OPTIONAL-I HUMAN RIGHTS LAW AND PRACTICE	The objectives of the course are to prepare for responsible citizenship with awareness of the relationship between Human Rights, democracy and development, to foster respect for international obligations for peace and development.
	OPTIONAL-I INSURANCE LAW	The main objective of every insurance contract is to give financial security and protection to the insured from any future uncertainties. Insurance Law governs this.
3	OPTIONAL -II BANKING LAW	This course is designed to acquaint the student with the conceptual and operational parameters of banking law, the judicial interpretation and the new and emerging dimensions of the banking system.
3	OPTIONAL -II RIGHT TO INFORMATION	The course is designed to convince the students how the right to information infuses transparency and accountability in governance, preventing abuse of power.
4	CLINICAL COURSE-I PROFESSIONAL ETHICS AND PROFESSIONAL ACCOUNTING SYSTEM	The course is designed to imbue students with these high value forming the basis of the profession so that they can live up to those standards in their professional life.
4	CLINICAL COURSE-II ALTERNATIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION SYSTEMS	The disputes, by nature are fit to be resolved through specific method of resolution. Each of these dispute resolution systems involve different style of planning and execution. The skills involved are also different as also preparation. This course trains the students in ADRs.

No.of Subject	Title of the Paper	Course Outcome
1	COMPANY LAW	The course is designed to understand the formation, management and other activities of the companies.
2	CIVIL PROCEDURE CODE AND LIMITATION ACT	This course is designed to acquaint the students with the various stages through which a civil case passes through, and the connected matters.
3	OPTIONAL –III INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS-I	The course is designed with a view to create IPR consciousness and familiarize the learners about the documentation and administrative procedures relating to IPR in India.
3	OPTIONAL –III PENOLOGY AND VICTIMOLGY	This course offers a specialist undertaking of criminal policies including theories of punishment, their supposed philosophical and sociological justifications and the problem of exercise of discretion in sentencing.
4	OPTIONAL-IV INTERPRETATION OF STATUTES AND PRINCIPLES OF LEGISLATION	This course deals with proper study of rules and principles relating to interpretation of statutes. It also deals with techniques adopted by the courts in construing statutes, how far they are successful in strategy and studies the problems and perspectives of the rules with this view.
4	OPTINAL –IV COMPETITION LAW	This course is designed to give the students an insight into the Competition Act, 2002. It enables the students to under stand the role of competitive market in the economic development of the country, anti –competitive practices and its impact on socio legal scenario of the country.
5	CLINICAL COURSE – III DRAFTING, PLEADING AND CONVEYENCE	The course aims at equipping the students with drafting skills.



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SEMESTER-6

No.of Subject	Title of the Paper	Course Outcome
1	LAW OF EVIDENCE	The course is designed to acquaint the students with the rules of evidence in relation to relevancy of facts and proof.
2	ENVIRONMENTAL LAW	The important principles in the field like intergeneration equity, carrying capacity, sustainable development and precautionary principle, polluter pay principles are to be appreciated. The law in practice is to be analysed and evaluated. The course is designed towards these objectives.
3	OPTIONAL – V INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS-II	The course is designed with a view to create IPR consciousness and familiarize the learners about the documentation and administrative procedures relating to IPR in India.
3	OPTIONAL – V WHITE COLLAR CRIMES	This course focuses on the criminality of the privileged classes- the wielders of all forms of state and social power. The course focuses on the relation between privilege, power and deviant behavior.
4	OPTIONAL – VI - LAND LAW	To introduce them to diverse aspects of land dealing like land revenue, prohibition of transfer acquisition, conversion, compensation, rehabilitation, resettlement etc. This course is designed towards this end.
4	OPTIONAL – VI LAW RELATING TO INTERNATIONAL TRADE.	This course is worked out to provide the future lawyers basic inputs in the area of international trade law.
5	CLINICAL COURSE – IV MOOT COURT EXERCISE AND INTERNSHIP	This course is designed to hone advocacy skill in the students. Moot Courts are simulation exercises geared up to endow students with facility in preparation of written submissions and planning, organizing and marshalling arguments in the given time so as to convince the presiding officer.
